# Smoking Ban Recommendation

# Smoking is a leading case of death

- Cigarette smoking causes more than 480,000 deaths each year in the United States. This is nearly one in five deaths.
- More than 10 times as many U.S. citizens have died prematurely from cigarette smoking than have died in all the wars fought by the United States.<sup>1</sup>
- Smoking causes about 90% (or 9 out of 10) of all lung cancer deaths.<sup>1,2</sup> More women die from lung cancer each year than from breast cancer.<sup>5</sup>
- Smoking causes about 80% (or 8 out of 10) of all deaths from chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).<sup>1</sup>

### Secondhand Smoke

- Secondhand smoke causes nearly 34,000 premature deaths from heart disease each year in the United States among nonsmokers.
- Nonsmokers who are exposed to secondhand smoke at home or at work increase their risk of developing heart disease by 25– 30%.
- Secondhand smoke increases the risk for stroke by 20–30%.
- Secondhand smoke exposure causes more than 8,000 deaths from stroke annually.

# Smoking Bans

- 24 cities in California
- Manhattan Beach used as model
  - Public Areas, Multi Unit Complexes, Sales Ban

# Current Applicable Smoking Bans

## **Smoking Ban Options**

#### **Environmental Committee considered**

- All public areas (sidewalks, parks, streets, parking lots, etc.)
- Common areas of multi-unit (3 or more) residential complexes.
  - Does not include hotels, motels.
  - Does not include SFR and duplexes
- Tobacco Sales Ban
  - Not currently proposed because a sales ban may have adverse impact on small businesses.

### Enforcement

- "Public enforcement"
  - Complaint driven
  - Lots of signage
- Fines
  - For blatant, repeat offenders
  - Can range from \$100-\$250 (Calabasas, CA)

### Recommendation

Direct staff to begin a draft City of El Segundo Municipal Code ordinances to ban smoking in:

- All public areas
- Common areas of multi-unit (4 or more) residential complexes.



- STEP 3 Audits from Partners (i.e. utilities and water districts)
- STEP 4 Business Implementation of Measures
- STEP 5 Final Site Visit and Verification
- **STEP 6 Certification and Business Promotion!**
- 6 week certification cycles






