How wide is your lot?

Urban lot split lines must be parallel to public street frontages and create no

more than two parcels.

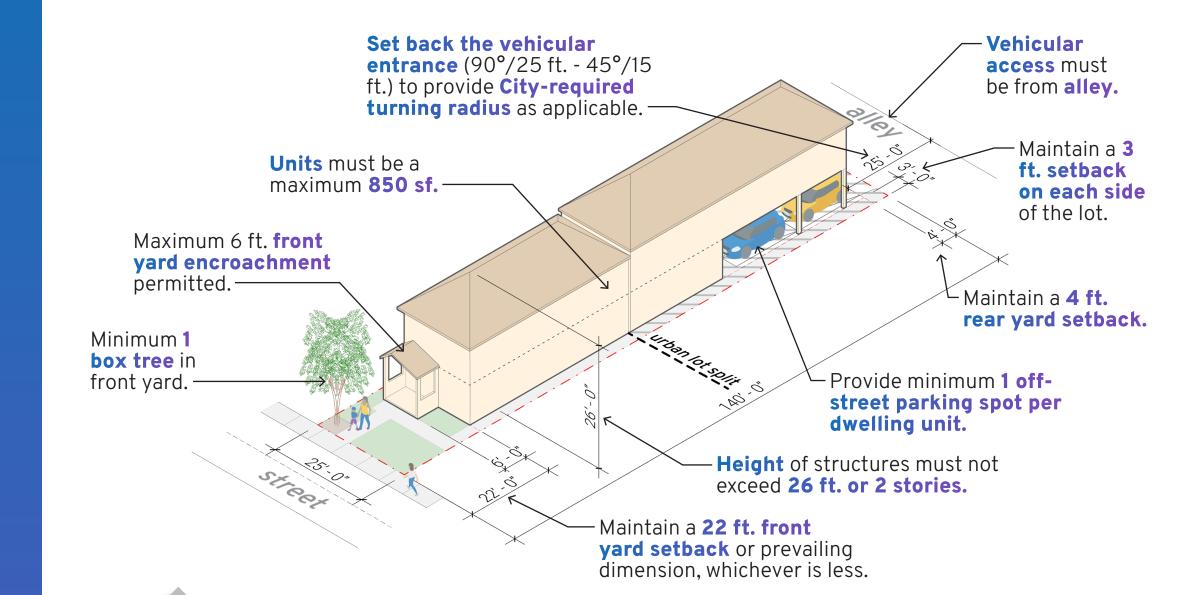

One of the two newly created parcels must be no smaller than 40% of the lot area of the original parcel proposed for subdivision.

Each new parcel must be greater than 1,200 square feet in gross area.

No more than 2 dwelling units per lot can be constructed on an urban lot split.

Each dwelling unit must be at minimum 800 square feet.

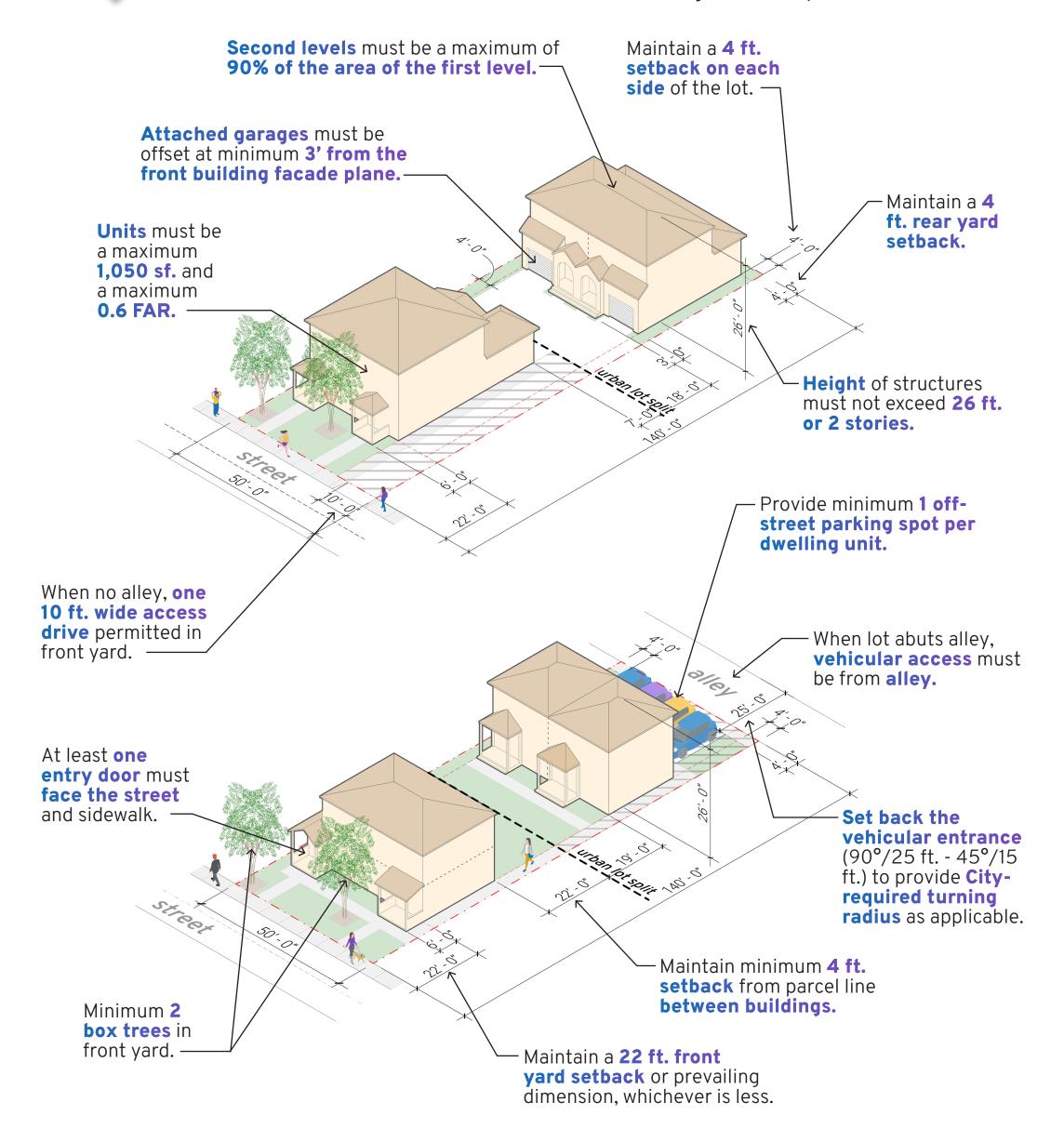

Senate Bill 9 (SB 9), also known as the California Housing Opportunity and More Efficiency (HOME) Act, promotes residential housing density by requiring cities to allow and expedite urban lot splits on a parcel in a single-family zone.
