After some time spent living abroad, Scott returned to America and, after watching 2001: A Space Odyssey for the first time, began painting astronauts and, sometimes, dinosaurs. Scott regularly exhibits his work in galleries and museums around the world, and his paintings have been profiled in Juxtapoz, Wired Magazine, and The Boston Globe. In 2018 the first book on his work was published by Paragon Books.

### ARTIST STATEMENT

This mural is titled "El Segundo Astronaut, the Cloud".

This design represents a theme of modern aerospace, with an astronaut looking out into the distance, a recurring theme and character in Scott Listfield's works. Vibrant colors and movement are also present in this original concept design rendering.

### ADDITIONAL INFO

MAINTENANCE PLAN: The paint that we plan to use has a UV protective coating in it. The colors will stay bright and vivid for decades to come. We will keep a watchful eye on the artwork just as we do with all of our murals in Southern California and will do touch ups whenever needed directly for the building owner.

WALL PREPARATION: The wall area will be pressure washed and primed with top-quality matte finish exterior primer prior to applying the mural paint.

ANTI-GRAFFITI: We will keep a watchful eye on the artwork and do touchups whenever needed directly for the building owner. Should the artwork experience any significant graffiti vandalism, we will consider applying an anti-graffiti topcoat in the future.

PAINT PRODUCT: We will be using the BEHR marquee exterior premium plus product, which includes a UV protective coating within it. This is an acrylic paint product.

PAINT APPLICATION AREAS: We will only be applying mural paint to the exact locations in the rendering, it will only be visible from the street and from the top of the parking structure.

TIMELINE: Our target completion date is Q4, 2023

LIGHTING: There will be spotlights on both sides of the mural location but they will not project directly onto the mural. The artwork will be visible and photographable at night due to the ample amount of ambient lighting throughout the area.
