Friday, February 3, 2023, 12:00 p.m.

#### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 12:00pm, held in the Executive Conference Room of City Hall in person.

### 2. ROLL CALL

#### 3. PUBLIC COMMUNICATION: None.

4. SPECIAL PRESENTATION: Mr. Ernest Kim from Siemens gave a presentation regarding conducting a study on the feasibility of adding solar panels on the roof of city owned facilities and installing EV charging stations by these facilities. Siemens has already conducted a preliminary feasibility study and identified the Public Works building and Fire Station #2 as potential locations for these projects. In addition to the solar panels and charging stations, Siemens located other potential projects such as LED lighting conversions and an HVAC upgrade that could result in large savings for the City. Mr. Kim stated that if the City decides to work with Siemens to implement these changes, they will guarantee the savings. The next step would be for the City to discuss and decide on whether or not to proceed with project.

### 5. REPORTS: PUBLIC WORKS

- a. Hyperion Update: Director Sassoon provided a status report regarding Hyperion. He reported that City staff attended the 1/25/2023 AQMD board hearing in which AQMD issued an extended abatement order to Hyperion. Further, AQMD issued a NOV to Hyperion on 1/17 for late reporting and failure to use an approved device to measure air quality. He also mentioned that Hyperion will soon be working to replace the tank covers and their improvement of the perimeter road project is still ongoing.
- b. CABGN Update: Ms. Martha Segovia from South Bay Cities COG provided a status update regarding the ongoing Cal Green Business Network progress. She reported that the 1<sup>st</sup> year program goals were met and the report was submitted to CABGN. She noted that the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the program now has a goal of 20 businesses and a new deadline of December 2023. This will mean a shorter time frame to get more businesses. She asked the committee for assistance in getting the word out about the program.

c. AQMD/LADPH Town Hall Proposal: City Manager George reported that AQMD has agreed to host the Town Hall with the Los Angeles Department of Public Health. Details and logistics regarding the town hall are still in the works.

a. Environmental Work Plan: Chair Miller-Zarneke tabled the item for next meeting due to time constraints.
